Mrs. Avo Oldham Dies In Wisconsin

Mrs. Avo L. Oldham, 64, died Friday morning (March 8) at LaCrosse, Wis. She was the widow of S. L. Oldham, who preceded her in death on March 7, 1960, and had made her home the past 7 years in LaCrosse to be near her daughter.

Mrs. Oldham was born on April 9, 1903 the daughter of Needham and Sadie Mullins Worth at Monroe, Iowa. On Sept. 11, 1924 she was married to S. L. Oldham at Monroe.

After their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Oldham moved to Newton and then in 1927 they moved to Grinnell to make their home. Mr. Oldham had worked for the Grinnell Glove Factory for 24 years and in 1951 became owner and operator of the Texaco Service Station at Grinnell.

Mrs. Oldham was a member of the First Baptist Church in Grinnell, the Women's Guild and Bronde Bible Class, and was the Missionary Treasurer of church. She also was a member of the Hazelle Club. Survivors include her daughter Mrs. Harry L. (Virginia) Lehman of LaCrosse, Wis., and her three grandchildren: Sandra, David and Robert Lehman all of LaCrosse. She was preceded in death by her parents and her husband.

Funeral services for Mrs. A. L. Oldham will be held 2 p.m. Tuesday at the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. Wayne A. Shireman, pastor of the First Baptist Church, officiating.
