Erederick Henry Oltrogge

Frederick Henry Oltrogge was born February 5, 1832. In Haelsede, Hanover, Germany.

Having been baptized in early inlancy, and later duly instructed in the fundamental Christian truths, he was at the age of fourten years confirmed and received into the communicant membership of the Evangelical Lutheran church.

After completing his education in the German Volksschule of his native town, he learned the trade of a loiner, being apprentices to Mr. Christian Werhalm, who subsequently became his sten-father.

When twenty pears old, Mr. Oltogge, together with the family of which he was a member, emigrated o America and shose the occupation of a farmer, which occupation he offewed in the richity of Grimeli, fowa. On the 18th of February, 1866, Mr. Oltrogge was married to Miss Anna Matzen. This proved to be a very Lappy union, and it was blessed with the following shildren:

It was also the privilege of Mr. and Mrs. Olfrogge to be the grand-parents of four bright little children.

In addition to the immediate members of his family, including his beloved wife. Mr. Olivogge's surviving relatives are:

Air. Christian Werhalm, his stepfather; Henry Oltrogge, his brother his five half-brothers, the Rev. Mr. Frederick Werhalm, of Throage; Mr. Christian Werhalm, of Chicago, Messrs. August, John and William Werhalm, or Great Bond, Kansas and his sister, Mrs. Ulrille von Holten, of Groensburg, Kansas.

Mr. Oltrogge had the reputation of being a good husband and father, as well as a staunch citizen and faithful church-member. To his credit be it said that he always stood by his pastor and by his unflinching loyalty lent him valuable support in the work of the Kingdom. Both in Mulcom Tawnship and Grinnell he was a member of the church board, and at various times he was elected as delegate to attend the symodical meetings of the Southern District of the Evangelical Lutheran Synod of lowa and other States. He thus, had opportunity for making the acquain-tance of many pastors and laymen outside of his own congregation. He showed ken interest in all church matters, and was a man of sound Christian character, so that his good name will abide with us as a treasured heritage.

Sunday, May 13. Mr. Oltrogge was taken sick very suddenly and on Thesday had to undergo an operation for appendicitis at the city hospital. On Thursday his condition became critical, and realizing that his end was drawing near, he by earnest prayer made preparations for meeting his God. Thus, on Thursday evening, at 11:20 he passed away as one who had kept the faith, and for whom there was laid up a crown of righteousness, as we have every reason to believe. Mr. Oltrogge reached the age of 55 years, 3 mos. and 11 days.

The funeral was conducted at the home Sunday, May 20, at ten o'clock by the Rev. H. Brucckner. Burial was in Hazelwood.
