Edward Oneyear Dies After Long Illness

Edward Oneyear, a resident of the Carnforth community for many years, died last Wednesday evening at a Grinnell rest home. He was 85 years old.

The son of Jefferson and Mary Oneyear, he was born May 14, 1877, at Millville, Iowa, and moved with his family to Dubuque where he lived until leaving for the state of Wyoming where he was a sheep herder on a large

ranch.

He returned to Iowa and had lived in the Carnforth community for 45 years, working on the farm and on the Northwestern railroad as long as his health permitted.

In May of this year he was taken to a Grinnell rest home and this summer he underwent surgery for a leg amputation at University hospitals in Iowa City. He returned to the rest home where his death occurred September 26.

He is survived by three sisters, Mrs. Adaline Shaw of Victor, Mrs. Mary Oderwaldt of Detroit, Mich. and Mrs. Lucy Spoerl of Tacoma, Wash. and two brothers, Scott and Harold of Dubuque. His parents, six brothers and one sister preceded him in death.

Funeral services were held at the McAninch chapel in Victor Friday afternoon at two o'clock in charge of the Rev. Robert Bowers. Mrs. George Keller was organist and accompanied Arthur Lang singing "In The Garden" and "Abide With Me".

Interment was in the I.O.O.F. cemetery at Victor with Wayne Dolmage, Floyd Fiser, Harvey Spading, Max Dolmage, Louis De Coster and Frank Roshek serving as pallbearers. Mrs. Lola Bushnell and Mrs. Margaret McBride were in charge of flowers.
