Isabella D. Woods was born Decem ber 22, 1828, in Portland, Chantanqua county, New York, and was united in marriage to George E. Onthank of the same place on September 7, 1851. They were playmetes in childhood. These came to Illinois early in the sixties Mr. Onthank enlisted in the Army in 1862, and Mrs. Outliank returned to her old home until the close of the war. when she went to the state of Missouri where her husband had an official position in a hospital in which she assisted They remained in that place for three years, then came to Grinnell in 1858 Here they celebrated their golden wed ding anniversary in 1961. She was left a widow on June 5, 1968.

To this union were born two children, one son and a daughter. The son was laid to rest on Mrs. Onthank's 80th birthday. She was not very strong the last few years and peacefully fell asleep in the Saviour on March 10, 1912, at her home, aged 84 years, two morths and 48 days. Besides her daughter. Mrs. George Brown, she leaves a brother, whose home is in Nebraska, and a sister in O'tlahoma, a number of grand children and three great grandchildren.

She was converted while quite vouns and joined the Baptist church continuing a faithful member of that body until death.
