Marion Osland Dies Wednesday; Rites Saturday

Marion Osland of 925 Chatterton Street died Wednesday evening at a local hospital. He was 73.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Saturday from James-Schallinske Funeral Home with the Rev. Ronald D. Spears, pastor of St. John's Lutheran church, officiating. Interment will be in the Sheridan Township cemetery.

The son of Sivert and Mary Iverson Osland, he was born May 11, 1893, at Stavanger, Norway, and at the age of 21 came to the United States and settled in the Maileom community.

He was united in marriage with Esther Tunison on March 8, 1922, and they farmed in the Tama county area for a while and then moved to the Chester township community. In 1961, he moved to Grinnell.

He was a member of the Lutheran church and the American Legion. During World War I he served with the U.S. Army.

Survivors include his daughters, Mrs. Calvin (Theima) Taylor of Kent, Wash., and Mrs. Melvin (Barbara) York of Grinnell; his sons, Wilbur of Grinnell and Norman of Wentzville, Mo.; 10 grandchildren; a brother, John, of Gilman; and a sister and three brothers in Norway.

He was preceded in death by his wife in May of 1956; a daughter, Wilma, in August of 1953; a son, Clifford, who died in infancy; his parents, and one sister.
