

Funeral Held Monday For Mrs. Ray Ostrom

Funeral services for Mrs. Ray Ostrom of Hartwick, 66, were conducted Monday afternoon at two o'clock at the McAninch Chapel in Victor. The Rev. Robert Cutbirth, pastor of the Hartwick Congregational church, officiated. Organist was Mrs. Everett Kornis who played the selections, "The Old Rugged Cross" and "Going Home."

Interment was in the Hartwick cemetery. Pallbearers were Fred Bees, Chester Simpson, Kenneth Rhinehart, Cecil Roberts, Adolph Chvala and Howard Olson. Flower attendants were Mr. and Mrs. George Williams.

Lucille Myers, daughter of John and Anna Myers, was born Oct. 3, 1899, at Cedar Rapids where she attended school.

April 5, 1920, she was married to Julius Dusterhoft and the couple farmed northwest of Ladora for a few years, later moving into Ladora before moving to Victor where Mr. Dusterhoft died Sept. 4, 1947.

In May, 1948, she was married to Ray Ostrom of Hartwick where the couple had always lived. Mrs. Ostrom's health had been failing for the past five months and had submitted to surgery in Mercy hospital in Cedar Rapids last June. She entered Marengo Memorial hospital October 29 where she died Nov. 13, 1965.

She is survived by her husband and a brother, John Myers, of Belle Plaine. She was preceded in death by her parents and two sisters.
