

Miss Paine rites today

Dorothy D. Paine, 78, of 512 Broad St., Grinnell, died Friday evening at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services are scheduled for 1:30 p.m. today at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Philip Ramstad, pastor of the United Church of Christ—Congregational, officiating. Burial will be at Hazelwood Cemetery.

The daughter of Edward and Bessie Douglas Paine, she was born July 16, 1901. She attended Grinnell schools, graduating from Grinnell High School in

1920. She later attended Grinnell College for two years, then received her elementary education degree from the University of Northern Iowa in Cedar Falls. She returned to Grinnell in 1924 and was a kindergarten teacher at Cooper School. She retired in 1962.

She was a member of the United Church of Christ—Congregational.

There are no immediate survivors. She was preceded in death by her parents and a sister, Ruth.
