## An Obituary Of John H. Palmer

John H. Palmer, son of A. F. and Sarah J. Palmer, was born in Ohio, Nov. 24th, 1854, and died at the home of his daughter, March 9th, 1932, aged 77 years, 3 months and 15 days.
