MAS, PHILOMELA PARK.

Philomela Minerva Bartlett Park was sorn in Bath, N. Y., July 23, 1839. She was the daughter of Stephen N. Mrs. Park died at Grinnell Tuesday evening, Aug. 25, 1903, of paralysis after a sickness of three weeks. Slav caves to mourn her loss three prothers, E. S. Bartlett of Grinnell. W. W. Bartlett of Cedar Falls, and S. M. Bartlett of Radchife, and numerous relatives, many of whom are promiaent in Grinnell and vicinity. An einier sister, Mrs. Eliza Ann Bartlett Howard, died in 1864, leaving a daugtter, now Alice Howard Longley of Grinnell. The funeral took place Thursday at three o'clock at the home or her brother, E. S. Bartlett. The services were conducted by Rev. E. M. Vittum, her pastor. Interment was in Hazelwood.
