## Alvin T. Parmley Was Well Known Here

Alvin T. Parmley was born June 13, 1847, in Wayne Co., Ky., died Aug. 30, 1924, at his home in Long Beach, California. Age 77 years, 2 months and 17 days.

In 1870 he moved to Rock Creek, Jasper Co., Iowa, where he lived until 1890. In 1872 he was married to Anna Burnett, daughter of John and Artameson Burnett, of Wayne Co., Ky. To this union were born seven children, the eldest dying in infancy. The living are:

In 1866 he was baptized into the eights and privileges of Bethel Church of the Predestinarian Baptists by Eller Cooper and lived his religion until he last moment of earthly life.
