Personal Recollections Of J. H. Patton

By W. C. Ray. The stars which guided J. H. Patton were not the kind which led him to enjoy a quiet and profitable life. He came to Iowa in 1877 and I became acquainted with him in the spring of 1882. For about a year or so he conducted a newspaper in Keokuk and later came to Grinnell and formed a partnership in the Grinnell Independent with J. M. Chamberlain. Mr. Patton was treasurer of Grinnell College and an ardent minister and his principles were always on the side of right. Under this kind of leadership Mr. Patton grew up in the newspaper business. While he has been spoken of as one of the Powsheick county bar, he might also be spoken of as one of the Powsheick county journalists, because no one has lived here of his generation except Mr. Patton who ran The Grinnell Independent.

Personal Recollections Of J. H. Patton

By W. C. Ray. I cannot tell the entire record of Mr. Patton in journalism here, but the old Independent was sold to E. E. Shuff & I became known as the "Independent Signal." After the sale to C. E. Shuff & Son, he retained the employ as printer and reporter on The Grinnell Herald with S. A. Cravath. While holding this position he was nominated and elected county clerk. On a single legal mind, he began his study of law in the county clerk's office and when he had served three terms as clerk, he moved from Mountaena back to Grinnell and formed a partnership with L. D. Kemmerer. In young attorney, and under the name of Patton & Kemmerer, he began his legal profession in Grinnell.
