Kellogg, Ind. March 8, Special:

C. M. Paul, a former prominent citizen of this city, died at the home of his son in Glendale, Calif., Friday afternoon, February 19, according to word received here last week. He had been in failing health for some time and an invalid for the past three years. Funeral services were held in Glendale and burial was made in Medford, Oregon, beside his wife who preceded him in death seven years ago.

Mr. Paul made his home in and near Kellogg from 1880 until 1905 during which time he served as clerk in the Burton and Company Bank, as assistant in the post office and as teacher in the city schools.

He united with the Christian church at an early age and was closely identified with that organization in each place he lived serving as an officer and teacher in the Bible school here and at Medford, Oregon, where the family lived from 1905 until the death of his wife in 1926.

He enlisted in the 170th Ohio Infantry when he was 16 years of age and was honorably discharged after a period of service.

He was a member of the Glendale Post of the G. A. R. at the time of his death.

Surviving relatives include his son, Burton Wesley, and four grandsons, all of Glendale, California.
