On Sept. 11, 1935, she was married to <u>David A. Paul</u> at Iowa City. All but two years of the couple's married life was spent at the family home near Gilman.

Mrs. Paul was a graduate of Clarence (Kan.) High School and received bachelor and masters degrees from the State University of Iowa. She taught art at Iowa City and Newton and the past 13 years was art teacher at the SEMCO Schools in Gilman.

Mrs. Paul was fine arts chairman of the Iowa Federation of Women's Clubs and was widely known for her presentations of illustrated inspirational programs. Her third book of poems had been published during the past two weeks.

An artist who was widely-known throughout the Midwest, Mrs. Paul had presented several one-man shows. She had been elected to membership in Phi Beta Kappa Pi Lambda Theta and Delta Kappa Gamma honorary sororities. She was honored in the Blue Book of Londan which lists leaders of the English-speaking world. She had also been elected to member ship in the International Poetry Association of Rome and was listed in the International Who's Who in Poetry for 1970-71.

Locally, Mrs. Paul was an active member of the Gilman United Church of Christ where she directed the Cherub Choir and had been devotional leader of the primary department of the Sunday School for the past 14 years.

Mrs. Paul is survived by her busband. David A.; one daughter. Mrs. Gene (Judith) Falcone of Philadelphia. Pa.: two grand-daughters who live in Philadelphia; and two sisters—Mrs. Lois Mever of Colorado Springs. Colo.. and Mrs. Alberta Tennant of Pueblo. Colo.

Mrs. Paul was preceded in death by her parents and by one brother in infancy.
