Newburg Farmer Oda R. Paul Dies Saturday

Oda R. Paul, 74, Newburg, died Saturday morning at a local hospital. He had been hospitalized the past 11 days.

Funeral services were held this afternoon at the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. C. E. Kingsley, pastor of the First Baptist church, officiating. Organist was Mrs. Don Renaud.

Pallbearers were Roy Brown, John McIlrath, Luverne Smith, Chester Humphrey, Harold McCulloch and Ervin Claus. Burial was in Chester Township cemetery.

He was the son of Mitchell and Caroline Crouch Paul and was born May 11th, 1886, at Parkville, Mo., and received his early education at the Parkville rural schools.

During World War I he served with the U. S. Army in France and later, on July 30th, 1925, was united in marriage with Sarah Louisa Woner. To this union was born one son, Richard Paul of Rte. 2, Kellogg.

Other survivors include one granddaughter and several brothers and sisters: Mrs. Lewis Koger of Newburg, William Paul of Brooklyn, Watson Paul of Connecticut, Mrs. John Korneman of Missouri, Mrs. Raymond Gall of California, Mrs. Weldon Sherman of Michigan, and Charles and Kenneth Paul of Connecticut.

He was preceded in death by his parents, and his wife Louise on Jan. 20th, 1952.

Mr. Paul moved to the Newburg area from Kansas City, Mo., and lived in the Hickory Grove area about 30 years. He had farmed 28 years on the same farm. He was a member of the Newburg American Legion.
