

James Paulson 1934 Dies At Kellogg

Kellogg, Ia., Jan. 5, Special:

Funeral services for James Paulson who died suddenly at his home here Sunday morning at 6 o'clock, were held at the Christian church Tuesday afternoon at 2:30, with Rev. W. G. Weber, pastor of the local Lutheran church, in charge of the rites. Burial was made in the family lot in Our Silent City.

James Hanson Paulson was born in Sleswig, Denmark, March 5, 1854. He was confirmed in the faith of the Lutheran church in early life and came to this country in 1876, locating at this place, where he has made his home since.

He was united in marriage to Miss Christina Peterson, Aug. 24, 1882, and eight children were born of this union, four of whom are still living. Two sons died in infancy, a daughter in 1923 and a son in 1907. Mrs. Paulson preceded him in death Dec. 26, 1932.

About three years ago he was stricken with paralysis and has been in poor health since that time. Death came from complications arising from that stroke.

Surviving relatives include four daughters, Mrs. Will Veber of Kellogg, Mrs. Sheridan Rice of Grinnell, Mrs. Olin Murphy of Murphy, and Mrs. E. G. Tough of Earlham; 19 grandchildren and one great grandchild, also one brother, Nelse Paulson of Des Moines. Two brothers and a sister preceded him in death.
