

**Mary Schilder Paulson
Funeral Service
Conducted Oct. 31 1965**

Mary Emeline Schilder, daughter of George and Magdalene Fischer Schilder, was born on a farm south of Malcom, Aug. 4, 1886, and died early Sunday afternoon, Oct. 29, at St. Francis hospital, Grinnell. She was 75 years of age.

She spent her young life at her parents' home and attended school in Malcom, graduating with the class of 1905.

She and her father and mother later moved to a home in Brooklyn, where she continued to live until her death. She was the youngest of 10 children.

She became a member of Grace Methodist church in Brooklyn July 21, 1910. In 1911 she entered nurses' training at the Methodist Hospital in Des Moines.

In October 1921 she was united in marriage at Montezuma to Carl Paulson. They lived in Des Moines for a short time following their marriage and then returned to the family home in Brooklyn. Two sons were born, Carl Francis and Paul Richard. Surviving relatives include her husband, Carl; her sons, Carl of Des Moines and Paul of Brooklyn, other relatives and friends.

Held Here Monday**

Funeral services for Carl Paulson, 75, who died Saturday in Doctors' Hospital in Des Moines, were held Monday afternoon at two o'clock at Bramer Funeral Home. The Rev. C.W. Woollard, pastor of Grace Methodist church, officiated and Leo Shuler was organist.

Burial was in Ivy Hill cemetery at Malcom with the following serving as pallbearers: Fred Hubbard of Montezuma and Guy Ormiston, Robert Belland, August Lacaeysse, John Edelen and Lester Duffus. In charge of flowers were Mrs. Lester Duffus and Mrs. August Lacaeysse.

Carl Paulson, son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Nels Paulson, was born in Kellogg July 31, 1889, and died May 8, 1965, in Des Moines.

He attended school in Kellogg and on his 21st birthday began working for the Rock Island railroad. He worked as brakeman and conductor until retiring in 1960.

He was married to Mary Emeline Schilder in Montezuma October, 1921. The couple lived in Des Moines for a brief time and returned to the family home in Brooklyn.

He is survived by two sons, Carl of Des Moines and Paul of Brooklyn.
