# Malcom And Gilman Boys Die In Wreck

Eldon Pearce, Howard Hill Are Victims; Four Others Are Hospitalized

Two area youths were killed and four others injured as the result of a two-car headon crash one mile east of Gilman on Highway 146 about 10:30 p.m. Friday. Dead

Killed instantly were Eldon G. Pearce, 19, of Malcom, and

Howard D. Hill, 21, of Gilman. Injured and hospitalized were Dean Kriegel, 19, Malcom; Bob Weitzel, 24, Malcom; Roger Peters, 18, Grinnell, and Gene Daugherty, 19. Gilman. The injured youths were all rushed to Grinnell hospitals and on Saturday Weitzell was transferred to Iowa City for further treatment.

#### Level Highway

Scene of the death crash was i straight, level stretch of highvay, and visibility was clear. investigating officers have not seen able to determine the what cause of the crash.

Pearce was a passenger in a 957 model auto driven by Krie-191. Also in the Kriegel car were Perers and Weitzell. Hill was riding in a 1954 model car driven by Daugherty. Both of the dead youths were riding in the front seat on the side opposite the Rev. Loren Parker, minister the driver.

#### Can't Recall Crash

Highway Patrolman James Louder said that none of the cemetery. survivors were able to recall any of the details or events just prior to the crash. Leuders inhospitals on the day following the smash-up.

The two cars met head-on but remained right side up after spinning around and facing the opposite direction on the road.

### Returning Home

It is believed that the youth: in the Kriegel car were returning home after attending a basketball game at Van Cleve. It is not known where the Daugnerty car was going.

Both cars were completely demolished. Leuder indicated that no charges were filed immediately but that there was a possibility that certain charges might be made following a complete investigation.

#### Injuries

Extent of injuries and conditions of the survivors are as follows:

Kriegel: compound fractures of the leg and elbow and multiple cuts of the face, hands, and knees. Condition fair. Weitzel: fractured jaw

arm, Condition fair.

Peters: possible internal injuries and suffering from sheek. Condition good.

Daugharty: broken leg and cuts on the face. Condition good.
