**Phil Peters, Retired
Railroad Man, Laid to Rest**

Phillip, son of Martha and George Peters, was born in Iowa City, Iowa, on Oct. 14, 1902, and passed away at his home in Deep River, Iowa, Oct. 19, 1965, at sixty-three years of age.

In his youth, he moved with his family to Brooklyn, Iowa, where he attended school.

As a young man he worked for the Marion Supply Company in Texas. In Pampa, Texas, he was united in marriage with Winnie M. Thorn, on Dec. 18, 1923. To this union, two daughters were born.

In 1931 the family moved to Montezuma, where he worked as a day laborer. In 1936, they moved to Deep River, where he was employed by the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad. Later, he was transferred to Tipton and for a while they lived in Tipton; however, they maintained their home in Deep River.

Phillip was preceded in death by his parents and one half-brother, Roy Noble.

He is survived by his wife and their two daughters, Darly Kuch of Gibson, and Leta Horn of China Lake, Calif.; seven grandchildren; one brother, Ralph Peters of Montezuma; other relatives and many friends.
