Peterson graduated from Grinnell College in 1932, working his way through school officiating high school athletic contests. After three years at Grinnell, he taught and coached at Centerville, then entered the school system in Long Beach, where he became supervisor of attendance in the city's schools.

He organized the Boys' Clubs of America for Long Beach, and his rehabilitation program in the Long Beach schools brought that city a reputation as a model city for juvenile behavior.
