Former Grinnellian, Back for Holidays, Fatally Hurt as Car Leaves No. 6, Rolls

Science 19 Prepri 23-year-old former Grunnellian, was fatally injured in an automobile accident at the Madison corner about 5 miles west of Grinnell on highway 6 about 5 a.m. Saturday morning.

Pheips aied at Community respital about 7:45 a.m. without regaining consciousness. He suffered a basal skull fracture, a fracture of the left arm and probable multiple internal injuries in the crash.

Fell Asleep

Jasper county Deputy Sheriff Times Holts stated that Phelps apparently fell askeep at the wheel of his eastbound 1932 Plymouth just prior to the accident.

The car left the highway as it went into the curve, rolled several times and came to rest unside down in the ditch some 100 feet from where it had left the road.

Phelps, who was driving alone to drown clear of the wavel to was found, uncosed to draw the completely wrocked remains of his car.

Dies In Hospital

He was taken to Community tospital by an ambulance furnished by the James Funeral home. He remained unconscious at the hospital and died about 2 hours and 45 minutes after the crash.

Grinnell police were first nauffed of the accident by an Interstate transport truck driver who telephoned the department from near the scene of the accident. The Grinnell department then notified Newton police, since the wreek occurred in Jasper ounty.

Besides Huitt, highway patro-men Lueders and Walker also were at the scene of the accident.

Born In Grinnell

Pholps, who was born in Grannell, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Clayton Phelps, His father used to operate the Raven restaurant, now Reed's Snack shop, on Main street,

Both parents left Grinnell Wennesday on their way to Victoria. Texas, where Clayton Pheips has accepted a government position.

They were reached in Victoria Saturday morning and flew back to Grinnell in the afternoon to attend their son's funeral today.
