He attended Cedar Rapids Business College for two years and was later graduated from Worsham College of Mortuary Science in Chicago.

Following his graduation, Mr. Phillips was employed by a Marengo funeral home. He moved to Grinnell in 1930 and was employed by Snyder Brothers Furniture and Undertaking until 1943.
