MRS. THOMAS R. PHIPPS IS DEAD

Passed Away Monday Night At
Home Of Her Brother
John Rice

FUNERAL WILL BE HELD
WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

Mrs. Phipps Lived Many Years In
This Vicinity But Recently Has
Lived in Keota

Mrs. Thomas R. Phipps, died Monday night at the home of her brother, John Rice, at the age of sixty-five years after being in Grinnell about six weeks for treatments.

Mrs. Phipps was a daughter of Eben and Rebecca Rice and was born in Wayne County, Kentucky, December 5, 1861, and came to Iowa in 1868 when she was still a child. She lived with her parents on a farm in Jasper County and on May 24, 1886, she was married to Thomas R. Phipps. Two children were born to this union, Mrs. Mamie Lewis of Oklahoma, and Roger Phipps of Keota.

Mr. and Mrs. Phipps made their home in this vicinity for a good many years and moved to Seattle in 1907, later moving to Oklahoma, and then returned to Grinnell for a few years before moving to Keota which they have made their home for the last two years. As was said before Mrs. Phipps has been making her home with her brother in Grinnell during the last six weeks and taking treatment.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at two o'clock at the Primitive Baptist church on Spencer street and burial will be at Rock Creek cemetery.

Mrs. Phipps is survived by her husband and two children, and two sisters, Mrs. O. J. Turner of Turner and Mrs. James Lewis of Grinnell, and three brothers, Preston Rice of Newton and Ed and John Rice of Grinnell.

Mrs. Phipps leaves many friends and neighbors who loved her and to whom her passing will cause much sorrow.
