Lewis Ferren Pimlott was born Aug. 21, 1907, at Brooklyn, Iowa, and departed this life on March 10, 1957, at his home in Tujunga, Calif., at the age of 45 years, 7 months and 19 days, following several years of illness.

He was the son of Essie and Ralph Pimlott and spent his early childhood in Marshalltown. After the death of his mother, he, as a small boy, came to live with his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Pimlott, of Grinnell. He attended school here and later the family moved to Brooklyn.

On Aug. 21, 1935 he was united in marriage to Lucille Smith of Brooklyn, Iowa. To this union there were born two sons, Marvin and Lyle, and one daughter, Doretta Kay.

In their early married life made in I.O.O. they resided in Anamosa and Grinnell, Iowa. In 1935 they moved to Malvern, Iowa, where they operated a dry cleaning

shop. Due to Mr. Pimlott's poor health, he was ordered by doctors to change climate. On Dec. 26, 1956, he went to California seeking relief, which proved unsuccessful.

Mr Pimlott was baptized in the United Presbyterian church in Grinnell, later transfering his membership to Malvern.

He leaves to mourn his loss, his widow and three children. Also surviving are his father, Ralph Pimlott at Georgetown, Ky., his aged grandmother, Mrs. Martha Pimlott, and one aunt, Mrs. Sam Graham, several cousins and other relatives and friends.

Services were held at 2:00 p.m., Sunday, March 17, 1957, at the Smith funeral home with Rev. E. W. F. Holler of Brooklyn in charge. Music was furnished by Mrs. Rhee Auman, and pallbearers were Francis Barkley, Carl Eker, Carl Keeney, Art Smith, Don Sowerwine, and Paul Weber. Interment was made in I.O.O.F. cemetery in Brooklyn, Iowa.
