

MS well water to drink. 11-30-1900

—Clara Anetta Planalp was born in Hickory Grove township, Jasper county, January 15, 1870, and died at her old home Tuesday evening, Nov. 27, 1900. Miss Planalp joined the United Brethren church of that place in 1885, and lived a sincere christian life till death claimed her. She was a quiet, upright young woman, best loved by her most intimate associates. She was a great church worker, holding the positions of superintendent and organist for years. She also taught school for several years, ranking among the deepest thinking and most successful teachers in Jasper county. In 1895 Miss Planalp had her letter transferred from the United Brethren church of Hickory Grove to the Methodist Episcopal church of Storm Lake, where she was chosen organist, which place she faithfully filled. Last April she fell a victim to la grippe, from which she rallied sufficiently to take care of her church work and music class. As she worked she grew weaker, and the 1st of October her physician pronounced her incurable. November 2 she returned home, where in spite of medical attendance she rapidly sank away. The funeral was held at the United Brethren church Wednesday at one o'clock, conducted by the pastor, Rev. Mr. King. The pall-bearers were: R. Beatty, T. S. Mason, Emery Brown, Will Stark, E. Sheppy and W. E. Newton.

Mrs. P. A. Planalp and son of Ira, Jasper county, were present at the funeral.
