

Marion Plum rites conducted

Marion A. Plum, 64, of rural Tama died of an apparent heart attack Aug. 6 while doing carpentry work in Tama.

Funeral services were conducted Aug. 9 at the Harrison Funeral Home in Tama, with the Rev. William Schlöbner, pastor of the Sheridan methodist Church, officiating. Organist was Ruth Gross, and pallbearers were Dennis Nieland, Terry Daniel, James Haynes, John Van De Walle, Carl Schroeder and John Frahm.

Burial was in Sheridan Cemetery, rural Malcom, with military rites conducted by Enright-Schrader Post No. 73, American Legion.
