They moved to Lawton, Ok., in 1901 when Oklahoma was opened to settlement, and resided there ever since, on a farm which Mr. Prather secured in the well-known "drawing" for numbers for the privilege of se-lecting claims, which was the method employed to determine who should file entries.

Mrs. Prather has been in Grinnell recently with her husband—they having visited at the H. O. and H. D. Shaw homes in 1926 and again in 1927. Her health would not permit a trip here in 1928.

She was born April 17, 1869, at Newton, Iowa, and lacked but five days of having reached her 60th birthday.
