Frank Edward Quire, eldest of the family of Dr. Charles Edward and Sarah Taylor Quire, was born at Sully, Iowa, on November 22nd, 1867, and passed away on October 1st, 1959 in the St. Catherine Hospital in Omaha, Neb. He was 91 years, 10 months and 9 days of age.

Frank Quire attended the Lynnville Academy and at the age of 16 entered Grinnell College for the study of music where he became an accomplished pianist. After this he gave piano lessons and also taught school. One of his piano students, Miss Kittie Quire later became his wife.

He later studied medicine at the University of Iowa prior to attending Rush Medical college in Chicago, Ill. from which he received his degree of Dr. of Medicine on March 29, 1892. Following this he began practice in Peoria, Iowa, the same year.

Dr. Frank Quire and Miss Kittie Quire were married on December 22, 1895 at LeGrande, Iowa, and established their home in Peoria where they lived until 1901 when they moved to Taintor.

In 1912 Dr. and Mrs. Quire and family moved to Lynnville

and his leg and hip were amputated on Sept. 26.

Survivors include one son and two daughters: Charles Quire of Lynnville, Mrs. Lloyd (Reva) Dixon of Hampton, Va., and Mrs. Dale (Ivo) Glascock of Papillion, Neb.; one brother, Fred Quire of Buhl, Idaho; two grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren.

where he and his brother, the late Dr. A. F. Quire took over the practice of their father, the late Dr. C. E. Quire.

Dr. Quire was a member of both the American Medical Association and the Iowa State Medical Association.

He received his 50 year certificate of the Masonic order of the Grand Lodge of Iowa in Feb. 1954 and was a member of the Masonic order for 70 years.

Surviving are one son, Charles F. Quire of Lynnville, two daughters, Mrs. Lloyd (Reba) Dixon, Hampton, Va. and Mrs. Dale (Ivo) Glascock, Papellian, Neb. Two granddaughters, Mrs. Roger (Joyce) Woodworth, Athens, Ga., and Miss Janet Dixon, Hampton, Va.; also one brother Fred Quire, Buhl, Idaho.

He was preceded in death by his wife in 1935, by two grandsons, Donald and Richard Quire Glascock in infancy. A brother, Edwin Quire died in infancy. Also preceding him was his brother Dr. Austin F. Quire and two sisters, Miss Mable Quire and Miss Veta Quire.

Dr. Frank Quire practiced for over 60 year in the Peoria, Taintor and Lynnville areas.

Funeral services for Dr. Quire were held Sunday afternoon, October 4th in the Lynnville Friends church in charge of Rev. Carl D. Byrd. Mrs. Howard Macy accompanied Homer McDowell who sang, "Beyond The Sunset" and "The Lords Prayer". Pallbearers were Reno Scull, Glenn VanGenderen, Howard Macy, A. R. Meredith, Ralph Evans, and Cecil Arthur. Flower attendants were, Mrs. Elgar Taylor, Mrs. John Willemssen, Mrs. Edward Renaud and Mrs. Roscoe Sparks. Interment was in Woodland cemetery where Masonic rites were conducted.

Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Dixon left on Tuesday for their home in Hampton, Va. and Dr. and Mrs. Dale Glascock left on Monday afternoon for their home in Papellian, Neb. All had been here for the services of the ladies' father, the late Dr. F. E. Quire.
