

Lyle C. 'Jack' Ramsey *BC Sept. 23, 1998*

Funeral services are at 10:30 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 24, at the Adel Christian Church for Lyle C. "Jack" Ramsey, 89, of Adel, who died Sunday, Sept. 20, 1998, of heart failure at his home in Adel. Burial will be at 2:30 p.m. Thursday at Brooklyn Memorial Cemetery in Brooklyn. The family will be present for visitation from 5-7 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 23, at McCalley Funeral Home in Adel.

Ramsey was born near Brooklyn, and has lived the past 67 years in Adel. He had served in the U.S. Army during World War II, and had been a maintenance foreman for the Iowa DOT, formerly the Iowa Highway Commission, retiring in 1972.
