William John 6-4 Rapson Passes

William John Rapson of 312 Obispo Ave., Long Beach, Calif, passed to his reward November 8, 1930, age 75. A native of Wisconsin, Mr. Rapson moved to Grinnell, Iowa in 1892, going into the grocery business with his nephew W. T. Moyle and continued in the business until 1912 when, on account of failing health he with his account of failing health, he with his family came to California.
