Mrs. J. M. Rayburn, one of the earlier settlers in the Montezuma neighborhood, died at Newton Tuesday after a long illness. Her maiden name was Mary Elizabeth Shearer, and she was born in Westmoreland, Pa., July 30, 1847 and came to Iowa when but twelve years of age .
