Poweshiek Co. Officials Aid In Search

H-R Oct 8,1956 Floyd Reeder, Father Of Four Children Dies In Lake Thursday Night

Poweshiek county cials were called to Rock Creek | boat. lake Thursday night to help search for the body of a 26-yearold Newton man, Floyd W. Reeder.

Reeder drowned in the lake Thursday night when he swam out into the lake to recover a a toy sailboat belonging to his son, Ricky, 5. Ricky and his father had gone to the lake Robinson, went once to the lake

The boy told members of the search party that when the toy boat drifted away from shore, his father took off his clothes and swam out after it. The time was estimated at about 6:30 p.m.

When his father did not return, Ricky went to the car and waited with a blanket wrapped around him. His uncle, Kenneth Thursday afternoon to sail the in search of the pair when they

had not returned home but di not find them.

Robinson went back later an about 1:30 o'clock Friday mort. ing found the car with Rick still waiting for his father.

Search Party

Jasper County Sheriff Ed Sco ville immediately organized search party, consisting of hi department, the Newton policforce, the highway patrol, peacofficers from Colfax, Grinnel and Montezuma and members o the Conservation service.

One of the boat parties drag ging the bottom of the lakfound Recder's body about 4:31 Friday morning. He had drown ed about 25 feet from the shore in about 10 feet of water ac cording to Sheriff Scoville.

Reeder's clothes were found piled on the bank of the lake. Born In Tama

Reeder was born in county, Sept. 11, 1930, the soil of Mr. and Mrs. Carl Reeder He married Doris Jannsen Dec. 28, 1950, at Kellogg. He worked in the paint department at the Maytag company.

The Reeders lived at 2400 South Eighth avenue East. Reeder was educated in Tama county schools. A member of the National Guard for four years, he was also a member of the Tama Methodist church.

Funeral services were held today at the Johnson funeral home with burial in Oak Hill cemetery at Tama.
