Clinton A. Rehling

A memorial service for Clinton A. Rehling, 85, of New York City, who died Feb. 18 of cancer at the Mayflower Health Center, will be held Sunday, May 10, at 2 p.m. in the Grinnell College Art Gallery. Burial will take place in Chippiannock Cemetery in Rock Island, Ill.

He was born Jan. 14, 1913, to Louis Paul and Lida Aabey Rehling in Davenport and graduated from Grinnell

College in 1939.

Following World War II, he attended the Graduate Institute of International Studies at Geneva, Switzerland. In April, 1947, he began an association with the United Nations during which he worked in collaboration with Gunnar Myrdal, the economist who was winner of a Nobel Prize in economics. He later was associated with Paul Hoffman, President Truman's first administrator of the Marshall Plan of aid to Europe, and with Dag Hammarskjold, secretary-general of the United Nations. From 1959 until his retirement in 1974 he served in the United Nations Development Program.

There are no survivors. Mr. Rehling was preceded in death by his parents and a twin sister, Cleo Rehling McFall.
