He attended rural school, graduating from Kellogg High School in 1925. He then attended the University of Illinois where he played football with the legendary Red Grange. A farm accident which resulted in the loss of an eye ended Mr. Reichelt's college career, but he later played semi-professional baseball for teams in Grinnell, Newton and Kellogg.

Mr. Reichelt operated Sherm's Fish Hatchery on his farm and also ran a grain and livestock operation. He was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church and had attended Hickory Grove Church.

He was married to Lillian Kimball Aug. 10, 1932, and she died in 1981. Also preceding him in death was an infant son, Gerald, and his parents.

He is survived by a sister, Katherine Schaumburg of H Kellogg.
