she has lived ever since.

She was united in marriage to Louis C. Renaud December 20, 1877, who preceded her in death on the 29th of last November. To this union were born six children: Izora, who passed away from this life at the age of 12 years; George C. of Lynnville, Iowa; Earl W. of Grinnell, Iowa; Floyd L. of Los Angeles, California; Della C. Brush and Beulah F. Ratcliffe of near Lynnville. Almost 29 years of her married life were spent in the Chester neighborhood. In the fall of 1906 she with her family moved to Lynnville, where she resided until the day of her death.

She had been in failing health for a number of months, being bedfast most of the time since last November. Through her long suffering and weakness she maintained a patient and resigned attitude until she passed peacefully away at her home May 27, at the age of 76 years, 9 months and

19 days.

Mrs. Renaud was a life-long member of the Friends church, and to it and the cause of Christ she gave herself without reservation. She was especially interested in the work of Christian missions, and in promoting the cause of prohibition of the liquor traffic. She wore the white ribbon and was a life-member of the W.C.T.U. The Sunday School and Prayer Meeting she loved to attend. By her life and word she bore testimony to right and truth.

In her home life she was ever gentle and kind, always thoughtful of those about her and will be greatly missed by those dear to her.

She leaves to mourn her loss besides her sons and daughters, four-teen grandchildren and a host of rela-

tives and friends.
