David A. Reynolds was born Oct. 7, 1893, near Brighton, Colo., the son of Isaac and Sarah Ann (Sally) Hicklin Reynolds. He died April 29, after a lengthy illness.

All his grandparents came to Iowa from Indiana in 1842 and settled in Keokuk and Poweshiek counties. His grandfather, Alfred Reynolds, was an early preacher in Poweshiek County, having organized the West Liberty Church of Christ, a place of worship west of Montezuma to this day.

Reynolds enlisted in the U. S. Army from Keokuk County and served 18 months in World War I.

He married Ida Mae Watson Sept. 14, 1919, in Union Twp. They moved into Montezuma in 1925.

To this union were born four children. He was a painter and decorator by trade. During World War II, he served two terms as mayor of Montezuma.

Reynolds was preceded in death by a son, Paul, and a daughter, Betty Jane. He is survived by his widow, Ida; a son, Harry, of Burbank, Calif.; a daughter, Mae Foster of Rockford, Ill.; eight grandchildren and eight great grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted May 2 by Brother Bill Ell at Watts Funeral Home. Burial was in Jackson Twn. Cemetery, Montezuma, with military rites by Blakley-Stevens American Legion Post of Montezuma.
