Harry M. Reynolds Sr., 73, of the Mayflower Home died Saturday morning at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services for Mr. Reynolds will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday at the Grinnell United Church of Christ—Congregational, with the Rev. Philip J. Ramstad officiating. Burial will be at Hazelwood Cemetery.

The son of Bernard and Margaret Fox Reynolds, he was born Sept. 4, 1903, in Grinnell. He attended school here and was graduated from Grinnell College. He pursued graduate studies at the University of Iowa, where he also taught freshman English. He later became an English instructor and debate coach at Allegheny College in Meadville, Pa.

On Sept. 18, 1926, he was married to Amy Hughes at Montezuma. Following their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Reynolds lived in Des Moines for a year before moving to Winona, Minn., where Mr. Reynolds taught school for two years. He later became associated with the Winona Monument Co. as office

manager and vice president. After his retirement, he and his wife moved to Grinnell. In 1962, they moved to the Mayflower Home.

Mr. Reynolds was a member of the United Church of Christ—Congregational, and he served as a lay minister at the Westfield Church south of Grinnell. He was state president of the Minnesota Congress of Parents and Teachers for three years, past president of the Grinnell Chapter of the United Nations Association, and vice president of the trustees of the Grinnell Historical Museum.

Survivors include his wife, Amy; his son, Harry M. Reynolds Jr. of Colombo, Sri Lanka; and five grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents; three brothers, George, Fred and Ben Reynolds; and a sister, Mrs. Cecil (Bess) Meyers.
