She later did graduate work at the University of Southern California and taught at high schools in Pleasant Plain and Van Cleave.

On Aug. 15, 1923, she was married to the Rev. L. Willard

Reynolds at Bangor. The couple served at the Southland Institute, a Friends mission school for blacks near Helena, Ark., then served full-time and interim pastorates at churches in New Providence; New York State; Indianappolis, Ind.; Minneapolis, Minn.; and Arvada, Colo., as well as Lynnville, Earlham, West Branch and the Newburg-Chester area in Iowa.

Mrs. Reynolds was a member of the First Friends Church of Grinnell and the United Society of Friends Women. She and her husband retired to Grinnell in 1967 and had lived at the Mayflower Home since 1985.

She is survived by her husband; one dughter, Sabron Newton of Chicago, Ill.; and two grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents, five sisters and two brothers.
