

## Funeral Monday For Walter B. Rhinehart

Funeral services for Walter B. Rhinehart, 85, who had lived in this community since he was twenty years of age, were held Monday at 2:00 p.m. at the Church of the Brethren. The Rev. Leslie Rogers, pastor, officiated. Pianist was Mrs. Ed Bartachek who accompanied Jo Ann Hulsebus, soloist.

Walter B. Rhinehart, son of Algernon and Mary Margaret Baxter Rhinehart, was born Sept. 22, 1876, near Linville, Va. and died July 21, 1962, at his home in Brooklyn following several months illness.

He came to Iowa in February, 1897. He was married to Mary S. Werner at the home of her father in Warren township on Feb. 27, 1900. Mrs. Rhinehart's death occurred the first part of this month, on July 6. Mr. Rhinehart had been an active member of the Church of the Brethren for many years.

He is survived by eight children. They are Mrs. Joseph (Irene) Roth, Leo, John, Raymond and Clarence, all of Brooklyn; Kenneth of Hartwick; Mrs. Orville (Evelyn) Prusek of Cedar Rapids and Wayne of Ames.

He also leaves one brother and three sisters, Worothy Rhinehart of Boulder, Colo., Mrs. Maun Montgomery of Des Moines, Mrs. Ralph Cahow of Stuart and Mrs. George Wills of Greenfield. Other survivors include 35 grandchildren and 48 great-grandchildren.
