1-30 Mrs. Ethel Rine. 1917 ^{G-44}

From a Wichita, Kas., paper we learn of the death last week of Mrs. Ethel Rine, daughter of Rev. H. L. Marsh, formerly of Grinnell. The Wichita Eagle says:

"Mrs. Ethel Rine of Augusta, a bride of two months, died at Wesley hospital after an illness of four days. She is a daughter of Rev. H. L. Marsh, 1701 Vassar avenue. Her husband is G. C. Rine of the Rine Drilling company.

"This is the second death in the Marsh family in less than a year. Last June Mrs. Rine's mother died. Mrs. Rine was 32 years old. She graduated from Fairmount college in 1909 and then found employment with the Price Current in Wichita. Later she became Chicago circulation manager for the Price Current Grain Reporter. A year and a half ago she entered the engineering department of the Chicago & Northwestern railway.

"When her mother died last June she returned to Wichita to live with her father. About the same time oil was struck on the Marsh farm west of Eldorado and Miss Marsh spent part of her time on the farm. The drilling was being done by the Rine Drilling company and in that way she came to meet G. C. Rine, to whom she was married Nov. 15.

"She is survived by her father, five brothers and two sisters. The brothers are: Will and Glen, students at Fairmount; Fred, of Flagler, Colo.; Paul, of Eldorado; and Eugene, a student at the high school. Her sisters are, Mrs. Myrtle Jones and Miss Edna Marsh, both of Wichita."
