Virginia Ritter Dies Suddenly

Mrs. Virginia Ritter, 45, wife of Francis (Bill) M Ritter, died early Friday afternoon at Mercy hospital in Iowa City after a brief illness. She had been hospitalized only five days.

Funeral services were held this afternoon (Monday) from the Grinnell Methodist church with the pastor, the Rev. Dr. G. S. Bruland officiating. Burial was in the Odd Fellows, cemetery at Montezuma with Smith Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
