## IS THE LAST OF PIONEER FAMILY

Mrs. Nancy Ann Rivers Died Sunday at Home of her Son In Grinnell.

HAD BEACHED ADVANCED

AGE OF 83 YEARS.

She Was the Widow of John L. Rivers

—Two of Her Five Sons

Survive Her.

Nancy Ann Ridpath, daughter of James and Sabrina Ridpath was born in Putnam county, Indiana, July 30, 1841, and died at the home of her son, in east Grinnell, Oct. 19, 1924

She came with her parents when a small child to Iowa, and settled at Springfield, Keokuk county, and here she grew to womanhood. On March 28, 1858, she was united in marriage to John L. Rivers. To this union were born five boys, J. R. Rivers of Grinnell, Edmond, Lewis Franklin and William, all deceased, and Jacob Rivers of Los Angeles, Calif.

In her early married life she, with her husband united with West Liberty Church of Christ, they both being charter members of this church, and she still held her membership there at her death. On June 11, 1906, her companion was called home and since that time she has made her home, most of the time, with her boys.

She is the last one of one of the oldest pioneer families of Poweshiek county. She knew all the hardships as well as the blessings of the pioneer life. As she saw the end coming she made most of the arrangements for her funeral and said to her son, as he sat at her bedside, "I am not sick and I have no pain," and at the very last she said to him. "Lift me up and take me in your arms," and in a few minutes she was gently laid back upon her pillow and with her head pillowed in his hand she quietly folded her own hands and gently slipped into the arms of Him who said. "Come unto me, all ye who are weary and heavy laden and I will give you rest."

The funeral will be held at the home of her son at the corner of Tenth Ave. and Penrose street at 2:30 Wednesday afternoon after which the body will be taken to the Blue Point cemetery and laid to rest by the side of her husband. Rev. J. C. Todd of the M. E. church will conduct the services.
