Raymond Rivers Dies Suddenly Friday Evening

Raymond Rivers, 59, of Grinnell died suddenly late Friday evening. He was bowling with some friends when he suffered the fatal attack.

Services were held this afternoon (Monday) at the Congregational church with the Rev. Robert Dewey, pastor, officiating. Organ music was by Norman Goodbrod. Rita Werneburg and Phyllis Marchant were in charge of flowers.
