Hans Henry Rix LuPasses Away At La 38 Advanced Age

Hans Henry Rix, son of John Henry Rix and his wife Katherine nee Brandt, was born January 19, 1858, at Washbeck, Holstein, Germany. In his infancy he was brought to the Lord in holy baptism and later on confirmed in the Lutheran faith, in which faith he died.

He came to the United States in 1875 and settled in Poweshiek county, Iowa, and for the past fifty years lived on a farm near Grinnell. In 1888 he was united in marriage to Miss Emma Kelm to which union were born one son, Frank, and two daughters, Mrs. Clifford Parker, and Mrs. Richard Wichman of Malcom.
