All old timers remember Mr and Mrs. Robbins well. Mr. Robbins for many years was treasurer of the college and the Robbins home was a center of hospitality and culture. Mrs. Robbins before her marriage was Abbie Whitcomb, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Abram Whitcomb, who were among the earliest settlers in Grinnell. Mr. Whitcomb conducted a harness shop back in the very early days. She was a sister of Professor Selden L. Whitcomb, now deceased, who for so many years taught English on the college faculty, and had several sisters.
