Moses Robbins, former wellknown resident of this vicinity and of Grinnell, died Saturday in a hospital in Little Rock, Ark., of Bright's disease, aged 62 years. The body was brought to Grinnell, reaching here early Wednesday afternoon and the funeral was held from the home of his father, Gilmore Robbins, south of Newburg, at 2 o'clock the same day. Interment was in the Gilman cemetery.

Moses Robbins was born in 1857 in Mercer county, Ill. He was married to Anna Dee, a cousin of Fred De, who preceded him in death eight years ago last January. He is survived by two sons, Gilmore and Harry, and a daughter, Wilma, his aged father and his brother, Will Robbins. Mr. Robbins for a number of years conducted a big farm which he owned near Newburg. Later he built a residence in Grinnell and lived here until about seven years ago, when he went south and has made his home in Texas and Arkansas since that time.
