The Mother Of "Billy" Robinson 1936 Passes Away Feb. 18

The Herald-Register has received word of the death of Mrs. D. A. Robinson, mother of "Billy" Robinson, Grinnell's pioneer aviator, whose career and tragic death won their place in the history of Grinnell. Mrs. Robinson has lived for several years with her daughter, Mrs. A. L. Clement, formerly Myrtle Robinson, in Kansas City. A letter from Mr. Clement says: "At home Mrs. Robinson was just 'Grandma' to all of us. She was always loving and kind and everybody loved her. She leaves many friends in our old home town, Norfolk, Neb., where we lived about twenty years, as well as many new ones here in Kansas City, where we moved in September, 1934. 'Grandma' contracted a cold about a month ago. It was quite severe, but she became better and in hopes of getting well, but soon became weak and pneumonia developed. Last Tuesday afternoon she passed away."

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at the Bergman Funeral Home in Kansas City, with burial at Floral Hills cemetery.

Mrs. Robinson was born in Malcom, May 19, 1860, and united with the Methodist church while a girl.
