trustee from 1962 until 1976 and from 1986 to the present.

Grinnell College President Pamela Ferguson said: "Mr. Rosenthal's dedication to liberal-arts education and his generosity have established a legacy for him at Grinnell and at many other institutions. He will be fondly remembered and deeply missed."

Rosenthal and his wife, Marie-Louise, have endowed two professorships at Grinnell: the Samuel R. and Marie-Louise Rosenthal Professor of Library Science and the Samuel R. and Marie-Louise Rosenthal Professor of Natural Science and Mathematics. Additional support has provided funding for scholarships, library acquisitions, and art acquisitions and preservation.

Rosenthal graduated summa cum laude from the University of Michigan in 1921 and with a law degree from Harvard University in 1924. He was director of the D and R Fund, a life trustee of the Highland Park Hospital Foundation, a member of the Dean's Advisory Council of Harvard Law School and a member of the American and Illinois bar associations. He also was a member of several civic and social organizations, including the Ravinia Festival Association, the

Newberry Library Association and the University of Chicago's Library Society and the Visiting Committee to the Library.

He is survived by his wife and a daughter, Louise Rosenthal Glasser.

Samuel Rosenthal

Samuel Robert Rosenthal, 95, a longtime Grinnell College trustee, died Tuesday, Nov. 1, in Chicago.

Private funeral services are planned. A memorial services was scheduled for Tuesday at Sinai congregation in Chicago.

Rosenthal, who had been a partner in the Chicago law firm Sonnenschein, Nath & Rosenthal since 1937, served as a Grinnell College
