Dr. Rowe dies in California

Dr. Charles Rowe, 82, of Chula Vista, Clif., a former minister of the United Methodist Church in Grinnell in the 1930s, died March 7 in California of a heart attack.

Services for Dr. Charles Rowe were held March 13 at Geyer Funeral Chapel there, with the Rev. Jerry Brown officiating. Burial was at Woodlawn Cemetery in Lovilia.
