Last Services _{G-H}; For J. H. Rowe Are Held Sunday \$-13-1935

Last services were held Sunday at Hull, Iowa, for J. H. Rowe, for many years a resident of Grinnell, who died Saturday morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Frank Nelson, of Sheldon, Iowa.

Mr. and Mrs. Rowe with their three daughters, Beulah, Lucile, and Irma, came to Grinnell in 1914 from Hull, and purchased the former John Evans farm by the old fair grounds so that the children might have the benefits of the educational institutions in Grinnell.
