When six years of age she accompanied her parents to Canada and on Oct. 26, 1830, was married to Wm. J. Rutledge, who proceded her to the better land July 30, 1877.

Of eight children born to this union four survive her: Mrs. Elizabeth Barnes, Rochester, N. Y.; Wm. J. Rutledge, Hutchinson, Kan.; Mrs. Mary Nash, Des Moines, Iowa, and Mrs. Nora Hays, Grinnell, Iowa.

In 1845 they moved to Illinois and settled on a farm near Oregon, in Ogle Co. At the close of the war they moved to lowa and on Nov. 1, 1867 to Montezuma. After a residence there of about 27 years she removed with her daughter Nors to Grinnell, where she remained till her death.

Mrs. Rutledge was a most lovable woman; affectionate and kind to all and always taking a deep interest in the affairs of her family.

She was a member of the Methodiat Episcopal church and a devoted Chris sian, having given her heart to God when quite young.

Although a great sufferer from injuries sustained by a fall early in March, she never complained and always had a smile and a good word for all.

Her faculties were perfect. It was a most remarkable fact considering her great age that she never became in the least, "childish." She was always cheerful and life never lost its sweetness for her.
